4. Public Comments:
  - a. Bill Thomas: Disagrees with Lichtenheld’s (Krupp’s traffic consultant) assessment that adding 136 more vehicles to University Bay Drive during the evening peak period would not be perceptible to the traveling public. University Bay Drive is currently overloaded, southbound traffic during this period currently is banked as far north as the top of the hill (north of the Unitarian Fellowship entrance); supports a traffic demand management analysis (a consultant to the

Village) that would evaluate the traffic demands on Marshall Court based on various mixed used models.

- b. Kristin Joiner: Places a high value on walkable streets in the Village. Supports a walkable commercial district from the Pyare Square building to University Bay Drive (University Avenue and Marshall Court) where pedestrians can look in shop windows, greet others and relax. Supports Marshall Court as a mixed use venue with small shops and restaurants that promotes walking to accommodate residents as well as the office workers with safety and a convenience that discourages the use of cars.
  - c. Stacy Cohen and Jonathan Jaffery: Moved to the Village primarily for a walking lifestyle. Supports the development of a walkable area along University Avenue for residents as well as to be an inviting area for others who want to visit coming by bus, foot, or bike. Attests to an interest among hospital employees to having close accessible eating establishments.
  - d. Jennifer Vadas Kuntz, Jen Penzotti and Petar Igetic: Developing University Avenue in a way that promotes a greater sense of community and a walkable lifestyle. Chose Shorewood Hills for the ability to walk or bike to work, to school, to the grocery store, etc... Better timing of traffic lights to make crossing the streets safer.
  - e. Jeff Jefferson: He would like a stop sign at Wood Lane and Lake Mendota Drive to slow traffic.
