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## PET LICENSES - DEADLINE APRIL 1

(Dogs, Cats and Chickens)

All dogs and cats in the Village must be licensed annually. To obtain a license, please bring your pet's most recent rabies vaccination record, including the vaccine's expiration date, to the Village Hall. The deadline for obtaining licenses is April 1, 2016. There is a \$5.00 penalty after this date. The late fee increases to \$10.00 after June 1, 2016. Even if your dog or cat is due for the rabies vaccination after the deadline, licenses must be obtained by April 1.

**HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE FEBRUARY 22, 2016 MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

*(Complete detailed minutes will be available on our website or at the Village Hall)*

**Attendance** – All trustees were in attendance.

**Appearances and Communications** – Kathy Lake, an Environmental Specialist with the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD), presented information on MMSD’s Adaptive Management Program and the Village’s participation in the program.

**Consent Agenda** – In an effort to expedite meetings, items on the consent agenda are considered as a group and are adopted with one motion. Any Board member may unilaterally remove an item from the consent agenda if he or she believes the item needs discussion. Consent agenda items included approval of the January 19, 2016 regular and caucus minutes; Street Use Permits for Tau Beta Pi (Pi Mile Run) on April 2, UW Kinesiology Club (Poker Run) on April 9, WI Track Club (Moovin’ 5K) on April 16.

**Ordinance L-2015-9** – The Board unanimously waived the second and third readings and approved [Ordinance L-2015-9](#) amending Section 2.02(9)(c) of the Village Code relating to the supplemental membership on the Public Health & Safety Committee with the correction of a typo.

**Ordinance L-2015-10** – The Board unanimously waived the third reading and approved [Ordinance L-2015-10](#) amending section 8.01 of the Village Code to prohibit the unlawful use of drones.

**Ordinance L-2015-11** – The Board tabled [Ordinance L-2015-11](#) amending section 7.08(5) “Parking, Stopping and Standing” (Two-hour parking on Marshall Court) to allow residents at Arbor Crossing time to review and comment on the potential parking restrictions.

**Ordinance L-2016-1** – The Board unanimously waived the first reading of [Ordinance L-2016-1](#) repealing and recreating Sec. 10-1-93 and amending Sec. 10-1-100(f) and (g) of the Village Code to comply with Wis. Stat. 66.0404 regulating wireless telecommunications facilities. Prior to the next meeting, staff will research questions related to appeals and jurisdiction.

**Ordinance L-2016-2** – Ms. Borisy-Rudin reviewed the Committee’s discussion regarding [Ordinance L-2016-2](#) amending section 17.06(10)(b) of the Village Code related to vicious dogs. The Board waived the first reading of the ordinance and referred it back to the Public Health & Safety Committee with questions regarding the intent of the ordinance related to vicious animals or just dogs, the 12 month time period for related incidents, what is meant by a “court of competent jurisdiction” and the provision that the vicious dog “may be seized by any person.”

**Ordinance L-2016-3** – The Board unanimously waived the first reading of [Ordinance L-2016-3](#) amending section 2.02(10)(b)4. of the Village Code concerning the charge of the Public Health

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**SPRING ELECTION**

Polls for the Spring Election on Tuesday, April 5, 2016 will be open at the Village Hall from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. The Municipal Judge, three Trustees seats will be on the ballot along with candidates for State Supreme Court, Court of Appeals and District Court; County Supervisor; and School Board. The Spring Election will also include the Presidential Primary voting in Wisconsin.

Please note that when voting for the candidate in the Presidential Primary, you can choose which party you will vote. However, you can vote for one of the candidates within only one party.

The Shorewood Hills League is sponsoring a forum on Sunday afternoon, April 3, 2016 before the April 5 Spring Election. You are invited to ask questions of the candidates for Municipal Judge and Trustee and hear their opinions about judicial matters, governance and the future of the Village.

The Forum will be held at the Village Hall from 3:00 to 4:30 pm. It will be moderated by a representative of the Wisconsin League of Women Voters. Refreshments will be offered.

**Intergovernmental Agreement to Participate in MMSD Adaptive Management Program** – The Village has been a participant in the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District’s pilot program which is now being expanded. The project and intergovernmental agreement allow municipalities to work cooperatively to comply with stormwater pollutant discharge limits. They can do this by pooling resources and using money to rectify problems where they are acute like rural non-point sources rather than expensive upgrades to municipal facilities that are not cost effective. The Public Works Committee recommended and the Board unanimously approved the intergovernmental agreement with MMSD to participate in the adaptive management program as part of the Village’s Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Wisconsin Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit. The cost to the Village’s Stormwater Utility is estimated at \$11,000/year for the next 20 years.

**PARC and Ride Bicycle Trail Grant Agreement** – The Board unanimously approved the Dane County Partners for Conservation and Recreation (PARC) & Ride Bicycle Trail grant agreement for \$22,400 to extend a section of the bike path from University Bay Drive west to the Arbor Crossing building.

**Purchase and Installation of Streetlight on Shorewood Boulevard** – The Board approved the purchase and installation of a decorative streetlight on the east side of Shorewood Boulevard at the intersection with the bike path to match the other lights in the area for \$5,768 on a 6-1 vote (Ms. Borisy-Rudin voting no).

**Consider Purchase of Accounting Software** – The Board unanimously approved the purchase of Clarity, an accounting software upgrade, based on the recommendation of the Finance Committee and staff. The new software will replace a program that has been in use for 16 years and is no longer being upgraded by the provider. Staff should recognize numerous efficiencies and be able to provide more detailed reports at budget time and throughout the year. The Clarity software platform is also more secure than the previous version. The \$39K cost will be paid over three years at no interest.

**Resolution R-2016-1 Tax Increment Agreement for The Lodge II at Walnut Grove** – Matt Dregne and Eileen Kelley of Stafford Rosenbaum provided a summary of the proposed Tax Increment Grant Agreement with Flad Development for development of the Pyare Square property. The project would include eight affordable housing units; consist of a developer-financed TIF grant in the principal amount of \$2.49M payable over the life of the TID with interest at 5 percent; cover the Village’s TIF administrative expenses first and make scheduled Municipal Revenue Obligations to the developer second.

**Closed Session** – The Board went into closed session to discuss the tax increment financing (TIF) request from Flad Development for the Pyare Square redevelopment project and upon returning to open session approved the TIF agreement for the Lodge II project.

**Supplemental Agreement to Tax Increment Agreement with Danford Plaza LLC for Development of the ATT Plaza Site** – The agreement was approved which will result in the Village receiving \$15,000 from Flad Development for public amenities such as playgrounds or public art that likely cannot be provided on site as part of the redevelopment of the ATT Plaza site.

**March Meeting Date** – The Board meeting was moved to March 28.

**Personnel Committee** – Mr. Imes reported that the review of the Village compensation plan was expected soon.

**Finance Committee** – Mr. Benforado reported on the status of the water rate case with the Public Service Commission.

**Adjourn** – The meeting adjourned at 10:53 pm.

## ELECTION INFORMATION

The Village's goal is for all eligible Shorewood Hills voters to be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted. Please contact the Village Hall (267-2680) if you have any questions after reading the information below.

**Photo Identification** – The Photo ID law will be in effect for elections in 2016. An informational flyer on acceptable forms of photo IDs is available on the [Village's website](#). **The photo ID does not have to have your Village address on it.** If you do not have a valid ID, please contact the Dept. of Transportation (266-2353) now to obtain one.

**Poll Location** – Village Hall ([810 Shorewood Blvd](#)) in the basement. Polls open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm.

**Voter Registration** – To be eligible to register here, you must have resided at your Shorewood Hills address for at least the prior 28 consecutive days. If you have moved to a different home in the Village or changed your name, you must reregister. A copy of the voter registration form is available on the Village's website or you may stop by the Village Hall to register (Monday through Friday, from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm). Be sure to bring proof of your residency in the Village when registering to vote. Common proofs of residency, among others, include a WI driver's license, a utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government document, or lease. The document must include your name at your Village address. Registration by mail for the Spring Election ends March 16, 2016. It is possible to register at the polls on Election Day but plan on spending extra time.

**Absentee Voting** – In-person absentee voting at the Village Hall is restricted to the two weeks before an election. For the Spring Election, in-person absentee voting will be possible from Monday, March 21 to Friday, April 1. Absentee voting on the day before an election is prohibited. In-person absentee voting therefore ends at 5:00 pm on the Friday before the election. Before receiving a ballot, you are required to show a photo ID. Ballots may not be handed out before 8:00 am. You must be registered in order to obtain a ballot.

**Absentee Ballot Requests** – The application form is available on the Village's website or you may stop by the Village Hall to request an absentee ballot be mailed to you. The completed form may be faxed to the Village Hall (608-266-5929); e-mailed to the Clerk: [cokie@shorewood-hills.org](mailto:cokie@shorewood-hills.org); mailed to or handed in in-person at the Village Hall. An acceptable proof of identification must accompany the absentee ballot request. You must be registered to vote in order to receive a ballot. An absentee ballot request can be made at any time and ballots will be mailed out when available independent of the two week in-person absentee voting period. The deadline to request an absentee ballot to be mailed is the Thursday before the election. A ballot postmarked by Election Day and received at the Village Hall by the Friday after the election will be counted. However, we would prefer that all absentee ballots were returned to Village Hall by Election Day. Those ballots can then be counted with the other Election Day votes and included in the totals reported that evening.

**Signing the Poll Book** – All voters must sign the poll book in order to obtain a ballot. The poll book contains a signature block for each voter. Anyone using a fictitious signature will be required to re-sign the book before he/she will be allowed to vote. Voters unable to sign the poll book because of a disability are exempt from this requirement. If this applies to you, simply tell the Election Officials that you are unable to sign because of a disability. You do not need to disclose the nature of your disability to the Election Officials or to any observers. Election Officials will write "exempt by order of inspectors" in your signature block.

## April 5, 2016 Spring Election – Candidates' Statements – Municipal Judge



### MARILYN TOWNSEND

I am seeking your vote for another term as Municipal Court Judge. I have served as our Judge for four years, and thank you for the opportunity to do so. My experience includes 30 years of practice as an attorney and 12 years of service as a Trustee on the Village Board.

As an attorney, I represent individuals and unions in matters arising under labor and employment laws, including gender, race, age and disability discrimination laws. I also represent persons with severe medical conditions who have been denied disability benefits by insurance companies.

Our municipal court hears and decides cases, including first offense OWI citations, other traffic offenses, retail theft, and offenses involving juveniles.

Juveniles present special challenges. I believe it is helpful for underage alcohol violators, and those accused of drug offenses to undergo a drug and alcohol assessment and counseling before sentencing. I also consider community service.

I believe it is important for the people who appear in our Court to have confidence that the Court is fair and that the Judge has heard and understood their position, regardless of how the Judge rules. I take the time to educate persons on the law governing each offense, the possible penalties and opportunities that may be available to mitigate penalties through community service and completion of appropriate courses. This is particularly important, because the caseload involves citizens from other nations, many of whom, reside in Eagle Heights. I am always aware that it may be a foreign defendant's only exposure to the American legal system.

I serve as a volunteer attorney for the Veteran's Law Clinic and the Unemployment Compensation Clinic. I also teach law students in the UW Lawyering Skills program.

My husband Fred Wade and I have three children, all of whom were raised in the Village.



### SCOTT FRIEDMAN

I am Scott Friedman and I am thrilled to be running for Judge of the Shorewood Hills Municipal Court. My family (wife Jo, children Toby and Mollie) moved to Shorewood Hills in 2013 to engage in a small community with excellent schools. I met my wife, a native Madisonian, while I was studying at UW Law School, and we were fortunate to have the opportunity to move back to Madison in 2012 after six years in Chicago.

As a full-time attorney, I work for a small law firm that focuses on the cable, broadband, and telecommunications industries. I am also fortunate to be able to work from our home on Lake Mendota Drive, which provides me with a daily perspective of the day-to-day activities that happen in the Village. For example, I am able to walk my children to and from school.

As judge, I plan to bring this unique perspective to the municipal court. My goal will be to preserve the unique character of our community by serving you as a fair and thoughtful Judge of the Shorewood Hills Municipal Court. I will conduct open and efficient proceedings, and I will work with our local police to ensure that our community continues to remain a special place to live.

Outside of the office, I enjoy playing tennis and coaching my son's soccer team. I am also, to a fault, an avid weather fanatic and a national weather service trained severe weather spotter. I earned my undergraduate degree at the University of Michigan. Although I am a Wolverine, I am grateful for the legal education I received here at the University of Wisconsin.



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a City of Madison program). Your pet license records should be kept in the community where you live. If a pet is lost or running at large, we can locate the owners much easier if the records are at the Village Hall.

**CHICKENS:** The Village now licenses chickens as well. Residents may keep up to four chickens (no roosters). Chicken coops must be raised up off the ground or placed on a hard surface. They must be kept clean, be at least 25 feet away from any residential structure and are prohibited in any front yard. Keepers of chickens must register with the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection.



Complete the Village's **Permit to Keep Chickens** form (available on the Village's website at [www.shorewood-hills.org](http://www.shorewood-hills.org) or at the Village Hall) and provide evidence of current registration with the Department of Agriculture. The fee is \$20 for the permit period of three years.

## STATUS OF REDEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

Redevelopment projects continue to consume much time for the Board of Trustees and Plan Commission members. The community engagement session on redevelopment that occurred last spring has been very helpful as Village officials consider projects.

**ATT Plaza** – Redevelopment of the ATT Plaza site has been approved by the Village. Demolition and construction of “The Boulevard” will begin this spring. The project will include 34 apartments with first floor retail. The Village is hopeful that an anchor component of the first floor will include a full service pub style restaurant, an amenity the Village doesn’t currently have and that we anticipate residents will enjoy nearby, within walking distance.

**Pyare Square Property** – The demolition and redevelopment of the Pyare Square Building and property is now very close to becoming a reality. The only remaining step is the approval of Tax Increment District #6 by the Joint Board of Review. This project will consist of two buildings containing 94 apartments, eight of which will be affordable housing units. It is possible the project will begin within a few months. The building will have to be demolished from the top down, piece-by-piece at an estimated cost of \$800,000-\$1,000,000.

**700 UBD** – The project underway at the corner of University Bay Drive and Marshall Court is expected to be completed in summer 2016. It consists of 54 apartments, including nine affordable housing units, and first floor commercial space. The commercial area will include a coffee shop (EVP) which will cater to pedestrians, bikers and neighborhood residents and a UW Health suite for employees affiliated internally with UW Health. The latter will not be a clinic type operation seeing outside patients. The commercial tenants will open sometime this summer and the apartments are scheduled for first occupancy on July 1, 2016.

**Psychiatric Services/Forest Products Property** – A two-building mixed use development to include apartments and new offices for the Psychiatric Services Clinic is also in the planning/approval stages (2725, 2727 & 2801 Marshall Court). A public hearing regarding this project will be held at the Plan Commission meeting on Tuesday, March 15, 2016.

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## UNLOCKED VEHICLES: AN OPEN INVITATION FOR THEFT


City of Madison residents are being warned by police to keep their vehicles locked, especially at night, since almost 100 thefts from vehicles had been reported in the City in January. In most cases, victims had not locked the car doors.

In Madison, theft from vehicles is at a four-year high for the month of January. The crimes are happening at night. Unlocked SUVs, cars, vans and trucks are being targeted, with victims finding interiors rifled and coins and other items stolen.

The majority of cases come from the West Side and Near West Side of Madison, in such neighborhoods as Regent, Westmorland, Sunset Hills, Rocky Bluff, Sunset Village and Hill Farms. All of these neighborhoods are near Shorewood Hills.

The Village hasn’t had any recent reports of theft from vehicles. But if the past two years are any indication, when the weather turns warmer and people are outside more often, the Village may experience a rash of incidents.

Please don’t make it easy on the criminals. Make sure doors on vehicles and homes are locked. Report any suspicious activity to the Shorewood Hills Police Department by calling 267-1110.



**REMINDER ABOUT VILLAGE POLICY ON POOL MEMBERSHIP SIGNUP DUE TO CAPACITY ISSUES**

In response to the growing popularity of the pool and in anticipation of continuing pressure on the capacity of pool programs, the Village Board has policies on pool membership practices we'd like to remind you about:

*All returning memberships, regardless of residency, are welcomed back to the next season and all new memberships received by the April 22, 2016 deadline will be accepted.*

*All membership requests received after the April 22 renewal deadline will be accepted on a first-come-first-served basis until pool capacity is reached. Returning membership requests will be assessed a late fee after the April 22 deadline. Upon reaching pool capacity, all requests for pool membership, whether new or renewal, resident or non-resident, will be denied.*

*There are a number of factors that contribute to needing to appropriately set membership limits:*

1. The Pool membership limit achieves maximum capacity for several important pool programs, such as:
  - a. The physical space of the pool is completely in use for lessons, leaving no additional space for the addition of more lesson classes. Lessons are included and expected with all memberships.
  - b. The swim team is at maximum capacity with regard to pool space. Additional swimmers cannot be accommodated beyond numbers of the past two years. All memberships are eligible to join the swim team.
  - c. Diving lessons and the dive team are at capacity.
  - d. Master's Swim classes are full, and we cannot accommodate additional swimmers.
  - e. Popular noon-time lap swim is often at a maximum capacity and creating stress with competition for space for lessons, divers, and water aerobics.
2. Also, on "nice" days, the pool is filled to capacity. Deck-side chairs are all filled. Concession seating is full. And enjoyment of the pool is limited by the sheer number of swimmers in the pool. Stretching capacity beyond these limits could threaten the ability to maintain the enjoyment and safety of patrons.
3. The Shorewood Hills Pool enjoys a wonderful relationship with the neighborhood but is conscious of the limitations of parking and the stresses of traffic. Parking is stressed on most days and traffic is always a concern in the heavily residential area of the pool.

The Shorewood Hills Pool is a customer-driven enterprise of the Village of Shorewood Hills and an important asset to the Village. The Village is committed to keeping the Shorewood Hills Pool an excellent experience that brings our members back year after year.

*To continue to reach out to new members of our community and to further recognize the investment of the Village in the Shorewood Hill Pool, the Village discounts membership to Village residents and in addition provides the following benefits to Village residents:*

1. *August memberships will not be closed to Village residents.*
2. *Village residents have the ability to purchase 10 daily passes per person (if a Village resident seeks membership after the pool reaches capacity, they will have the ability to use the pool 10 times before August, and may then join for August as well. This accommodation is an important gesture in welcoming new residents to the Village and our pool community).*
3. *When/if the pool membership reaches capacity, additional membership requests will be placed on a waitlist in the order that they are received. Within a given year, however, resident requests will be placed ahead of non-resident requests providing residents preference for the following pool season.*

**If you are interested in being a pool member in 2016, please be sure to turn in your membership materials on time (before April 22) to ensure you get in before memberships close for the season.**



# Cross Connection Control

## Bathrooms & Kitchens

### What is Cross Connection?

A cross connection is an actual or potential connection between the safe drinking water (potable) supply and source of contamination or pollution. State plumbing codes require approved back-flow prevention devices, assemblies, or other methods to be installed at every point of potable water connection and use. Cross Connections must be properly protected or eliminated.

### How does contamination occur?

When you turn on a faucet, you expect the water to be as safe as when it left the treatment plant. However, certain hydraulic conditions left unprotected within your plumbing system may allow hazardous substances to enter and contaminate your own drinking water or even the public water supply. Water normally flows in one direction to your faucet. However under certain conditions, water can actually flow backwards; this is known as Backflow. There are two situations that can cause Backflow: back siphonage and back pressure.

### Back Siphonage:

May occur due to a loss of pressure in the municipal water supply such as from a water main break.


### Back Pressure:

May occur when a source (such as a boiler) creates a greater pressure than the incoming water pressure.

### In the Bathroom Hand Held Shower

The hand held shower fixture is compliant if:


- The shower hose head is hanging freely, it is at least 1 inch above the top of the flood level rim of the receptor (tub).
- Complies with ASSE # 1014.
- Has the ASME code 112.18.1 stamped on the handle.



### In the Bathroom Toilet Tanks

There are many unapproved toilet tank fill valve products sold at common retailers which do not meet the state plumbing code requirements for backflow prevention.

- Look for the ASSE #1002 Standard symbol on device and packaging.
- Replace any unapproved devices with an ASSE #1002 approved anti siphon ball-cock assembly. Average cost for this do-it-yourself-type device available at home improvement stores is \$8 to \$22.
- Verify overflow tube is one inch below critical level (CL) marking on device.



# Do's and Don'ts

## Do...

- Keep the ends of hoses clear of all possible contaminants.
- Make sure dishwashers are installed with the proper "air gap" device.
- Verify hose bibb vacuum breaker on all threaded faucets around your home.
- Make sure water treatment devices such as water softeners have the proper "air gap", which is a minimum of one inch above the drain.

## Don't...


- Submerge hoses in buckets, pools, tubs, sinks, ponds or automobile radiators.
- Use spray attachments without an approved backflow prevention device.
- Connect drain pipes from water softeners or other treatment systems directly to the sewer drain. Always be sure there is a one inch "air gap" separation.

## In the Kitchen

Hoses and water treatment devices may create a potential backflow hazard if not properly isolated with backflow prevention devices or methods.



## Did you know . . .

Your water can become contaminated if connections to your plumbing system are not properly protected?

The purpose of the local **Cross Connection Program**, as required by State Plumbing Code and Regulations, is to ensure everyone in the community has safe, clean drinking water.

## It's Public Safety . . .

To avoid contamination, backflow preventers are required by State Plumbing Codes wherever there is an actual or potential hazard for a cross connection. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources requires all public water suppliers to maintain an on-going Cross Connection Control Program involving public education, onsite inspections, and possible corrective actions by building owners.
