**HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE JUNE 17, 2019 MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

*(Complete detailed minutes will be available on our website or at the Village Hall)*

**Attendance** – All trustees were in attendance.

**Procedures Orientation** – Mr. Benforado encouraged committee chairs to fully populate their committees.

**Consent Agenda** – In an effort to expedite meetings, items on the consent agenda are considered as a group and are adopted with one motion. Any Board member may unilaterally remove an item from the consent agenda if he or she believes the item needs discussion. The consent agenda included approval of regular and closed session minutes for the May 15, 2019 Board meeting; street use permit for July 4 Tri- It; block party permits for Crestwood Drive on July 20 and Wellesley Road on September 2; tobacco licenses for Blackhawk Country Club, Steve's Liquor Store, Ultimate Mart (dba Pick N Save), Walgreen's; Class A retail liquor license for Pick N Save; Class B beer/liquor licenses for Steve's Wine Market, La Brioche True Food, Blackhawk Country Club, VFMad, LLC (Vom Fass), T&M Ventures (Ancora Coffee), Sa Bai Thong; Class B beer license for Chipotle Mexican Grill; and temporary Class B beer/wine for Shorewood Hills EMS & Fire Association.

**Ordinance L-2019-2** – The Board took no action on [ordinance L-2019-2](#) related to parking and towing vehicles.

**Ordinance L-2019-3** – Waterfront Committee Chair John Voegeli explained the rationale for the proposed change to the makeup of the Committee. Over the years, the demographics of marina users has shifted towards more Village residents and fewer non-resident users. The Committee is also striving to be a working group with local members being active when issues arise. This was particularly evident during last August's high water events. Non-resident members of the Committee are not immediately available to assist. The Board was generally in support of the change and unanimously approved the second reading of [Ordinance L-2019-3](#) amending section 2.02(10)(c)3 regarding resident/non-resident composition of the Waterfront Committee.

**Financial Statements** – Vicki Hellenbrand, Senior Partner at Baker Tilly, presented the 2018 draft financial statements in detail. She reviewed a highlight package and the difference between governmental and commercial financial statements. Baker Tilly is required to use Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) standards when performing the audit and producing the financial statements document. Credit agencies and others use GASB standards to compare communities throughout the country. Ms. Hellenbrand stated that the Village received an unqualified clear opinion, which means all bills, payments, etc. are present and recorded in the correct place. During the fieldwork, the audit team analyzes the internal controls and identifies possible areas of risk for fraud. Even with recent staff changes, the 2018 flood impact and 2017 data loss, the Village's Management Letter is comparable to prior year's audits. She reviewed the major funds (General, Capital, TIF, Debt Service, Water, Sewer, etc.) and non-major funds (Pool, Waterfront, etc.). The General Fund balance is comprised of non-spendable, assigned and unassigned money. The overall General Fund balance decreased in 2018, but the unassigned fund balance increased because money advanced to TIF 4 was paid back and is no longer in the non-spendable category. Over the past 5 years, the unassigned fund balance (which is analogous to working capital in the commercial world) has been stable. The Village's revenue and expense breakdown is comparable to our peers. Excess expenses related to the August 2018 flood and police part-time wages were mostly offset by insurance claims and better than expected revenues. The Stormwater utility may need to adjust its rates in the near future. She finished by reminding the Board that the audit is a two-way communication process.

**Resolution R-2019-10** – The Board unanimously approved [Resolution R-2019-10](#) accepting the 2018 Compliance Maintenance Report related to the sewer system.

**Resolution R-2019-11** – Mr. Benforado recused himself from discussion of this item. Mr. Imes, President Pro Tem, explained [Resolution R-2019-11](#), which adopts a Public Participation Plan for a possible change to the Village's Comprehensive Plan. The Public Participation Plan lists all the requirements for proper meetings and documentation, if the Comprehensive Plan is going to be changed. The Plan Commission

is in charge of the change process and the Board only votes for or against a Plan Commission recommendation. The Board unanimously approved Resolution R-2019-11 (Mr. Benforado not participating).

**Appointments** – The Board unanimously approved the appointment of Doug Rahn as chair of the Board of Review.

**Village President's Report** – Mr. Benforado mentioned the University Avenue Public Involvement Meeting held at the UW Credit Union on June 14. It was the first public input meeting regarding reconstruction of University Avenue planned for 2021. The design maintains six lanes, including two left turn lanes to University Bay Drive, a new sidewalk on the north side, an over- or under-pass for the bike path at University Bay Drive and consideration for future Bus Rapid Transit. Mr. Benforado also reviewed the July 4th Celebration schedule and Trustee involvement. He also mentioned the Garden Club's donation of \$2,500 to partially fund the summer horticultural staff.

**Village Administrator's Report** – Mr. Frantz reported on the Shared Solar program through MG&E. Mr. Benforado recused himself because he is employed by MG&E. Mr. Frantz reminded the Board that last year he signed the Village up on a no obligation wait list to join the Shared Solar program. The solar farm is almost complete and the Village may be asked to join in the near future. If the Village chose to purchase 100% of its energy from this solar project, it would include a one-time fee of \$24,664 and an increase of \$78 per month during the first year in the program, but would result in a savings of about \$200 over 25 years. The costs could be split among multiple Village funds. Mr. Frantz asked if the Board was interested in joining the Program. The Board asked for more information on the contract and a cost analysis.

**Plan Commission** – Mr. Benforado reported that the Commission denied a request to put a shed in a front yard. The Village ordinance states that all sheds in front yards must be reviewed and approved by the Plan Commission. There is no guidance to accompany the ordinance. The Commission may consider this ordinance further. Mr. Imes reported on Degen & Associates proposal for redevelopment on Burbank Place. The east side of the street would be a 3-story apartment building with underground parking. The west side would be four 4-unit townhouse complexes, built in a second phase. They used the Vandewalle redevelopment objectives as a guide to the proposed redevelopment. The Commission did not make any conclusions on the proposal because it was the first time any of them had seen the plan. Rezoning and a change to the Comprehensive Plan would be required to move forward. Stormwater considerations for a possible tunnel inlet may complicate matters. The proposed redevelopment presentation is available on-line at: [Degen & Associates Proposal](#).

**Public Health & Safety Committee** – Mr. Friedman reported the Committee talked about the Habitual Parking Violators ordinance and goats. The Committee found no public health issues with the keeping of goats and referred the matter to the Plan Commission to consider zoning implications.

**Recreation Committee** – Ms. Bailey reported the Committee inventoried the Village's programs and spaces in order to have a larger conversation about recreation.

**Adjourn** – The meeting adjourned at 10:08 pm.

## MMSD SURVEY INITIATIVE TO ASSESS COMMUNITY ATTITUDES

The Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) is reaching out to individuals in its service area (including people in Shorewood Hills) to learn more about their knowledge of local wastewater treatment, their attitudes and opinions.

Questions are designed to take a pulse on current understanding of wastewater topics, and can be asked again in the future to track change over time. Respondents will be asked opinions, behaviors, attitudes on topics such as water softeners, perception of pollution, non-flushables, and mercury.


Randomly selected, adult residents of area communities will be asked to participate in a brief (about 15 minute) phone survey sometime within the next month. Phone calls started in early June and will continue until 500 surveys have been completed. Final analyses are expected to be completed by the end of 2019. ## WATER UTILITY INFORMATION

Are you tired of writing a check each month for your utility bill? If so, you should consider ACH or "AUTO PAY" through the Village. It is a FREE service where the monthly bill is directly debited from your checking account on the 20th of each month. Late fees will be a thing of the past if you sign up for the Village's ACH system. You will still get a paper copy of the bill in the mail but it will have printed on it: "AUTO PAY – DO NOT PAY". Go to [www.shorewood-hills.org/water](http://www.shorewood-hills.org/water) to download the ACH form.

If you signed up for ACH through the Village's on-line payment processor, PSN (Payment Service Network), contact the Village Hall, we may be able to save you some money. PSN charges a fee for each monthly ACH transaction, the Village's ACH system is FREE.

If you are environmentally conscious, paperless billing (eBills) is also an option. Go to the [PSN website](#), register your account, and sign up for paperless bills. Your bill will be e-mailed to at the beginning of each month. You will need your utility account number from your bill to register. Contact the Village Hall if you have questions or need assistance.
