VOTER INFORMATION

What you need to know for Tuesday

The Village's goal is for all eligible Shorewood Hills voters to be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted. State regulations do not allow voting or registration on Monday before an election. If you need to register, you'll have to do that at the Polls on election day.

Returning an Absentee Ballot

A law suit complicated matters related to using Drop Boxes to collect ballots for this election. The Village Hall's drop box has been locked until after the election is over. That may be a inconvenient for paying utility bills or submitting other things to the Village Hall, but it will ensure we do not have to disqualify anyone's vote because they used a drop box. Your absentee ballot can be returned by U.S. Mail or hand delivered to the Clerk's office (each voter must return their own ballot to the Clerk, your spouse or other person cannot return your ballot on your behalf.

In-Person Absentee Voting

Our in-person absentee voting hours are done at time of this publication. In-person absentee voting is not allowed on the Monday before an election.

Voter Registration

To be eligible to register to vote in Shorewood Hills, you must have resided here for at least 28 consecutive days prior to the next election. If you have moved to a different home in the Village or changed your name, you must re-register. You will need to provide proof of your residency in the Village when registering to vote. [Common proofs of residency](#), among others, include a WI driver's license, a utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government document, or lease. The document must include your name at your Village address. It is possible to register at the polls on Election Day but plan on spending some extra time.

Photo Identification

A Photo ID is required to receive a ballot and vote. The most common types of acceptable photo ID include: a WI DOT-issued drivers license, a WI DOT-issued identification card, a Military ID card issued by the U.S. Uniformed Services, or a U.S. passport book or card. The photo ID is only for proof of your identity, it does not require your Village address. **IMPORTANT TO NOTE:** An out of state driver's license IS NOT an acceptable ID in Wisconsin; a Wisconsin driver's license or passport may be expired if the expiration date is after November 3, 2020 (the date of the last federal election). There are other forms of acceptable ID for voting purposes (*see the [Acceptable forms of Voter ID flyer](#) online*). If you do not have a valid ID, see the [Free ID Card Petition Process flyer](#) online or go to: www.bringitwisconsin.com.

Poll Location

Village Hall ([810 Shorewood Blvd](#)) in the basement. Polls open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm.

Signing the Poll Book

All voters must sign the poll book in order to obtain a ballot on Election Day. The Village now utilizes an electronic poll book called the Badger Book that has speed up the check-in process. Voters sign a computer screen similar to those used at grocery/department stores. You will still be required to state your name and address, show an appropriate photo ID and sign the electronic poll book. Voters unable to sign the poll book because of a disability are exempt from this requirement. If this applies to you, simply tell the Election Officials that you are unable to sign because of a disability. You do not need to disclose the nature of your disability to the Election Officials or to any observers. Election Officials will record "exempt by order of inspectors" in the poll book.

The City of Middleton is partnering with Dane County, the Madison Area Municipal Storm Water Partnership (MAMSWaP) and the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District to host a county-wide household hazardous waste disposal event.

This Community Clean Sweep event will be held Saturday, April 23 (Earth Day) from 8:00 am-12:00 pm at the Clark Street Community School at 2429 Clark St., Middleton, WI 53562.

This event offers an opportunity for **all Dane County residents** to safely dispose of hazardous waste, household chemicals, and other items that pose potential environmental and safety risks. These are the types of items that should not be placed in curbside trash or recycling bins. The cost to participate in the event is \$10 per vehicle and advanced ticket purchase is recommended due to limited availability of tickets.

Dane County residents can safely dispose of household hazardous waste (plus electronics!) year round at the Dane County Clean Sweep Facility, located at the Dane County Landfill at 7102 US Hwy 12, Madison, WI. Please note, you should never just leave hazardous wastes at any location. Abandoning hazardous wastes, even from households, is a State and Federal offense.

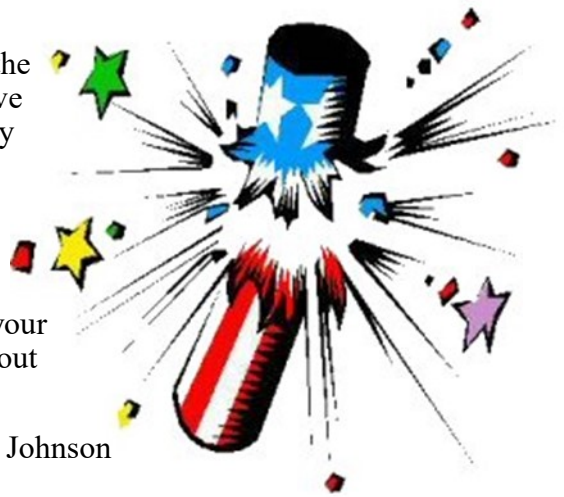

TIME FOR SPRING CLEANING!

The Village's cleanup event is back this Spring. This year the event will be held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, May 20, 21, and 22. On those days, the Village will have two 30-yard dumpsters available outside the Public Works garage (1008 Shorewood Blvd.). From 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, residents may bring items that have been collecting over the winter or over the years and discard them once and for all (items not fit for donation or garage sales, see the Green Team's Swap & Donation article on page #). Also, a Public Works truck will be available for recyclable metal items.

Most things can go in the dumpsters or metal recycling truck. But, we CAN'T take everything. Certain materials are banned from landfills because of their toxicity. They require special disposal methods to prevent environmental damage. Some materials may not be toxic but are prohibited for other reasons (for example: to encourage recycling). The [Dane County Clean Sweep program](#) may take some prohibited material or the Village's waste hauler, Pellitteri Waste Systems (257-4285), would be happy to discuss alternate methods of disposal of any of the items listed below.

RESIDENTIAL COMPUTER & ELECTRONICS RECYCLING ROUNDUP

The Shorewood Hills EMS & Fire Association, in conjunction with the Village's Services Committee, is happy to sponsoring an e-cycle event this Spring on **Saturday, May 21, 2022** from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm (which is during the Village's Spring Cleaning dumpster weekend).



Residents of the Village may dispose of their old computers, monitors, TVs, radios and other small home electronics by bringing them to the Public Works Garage (1008 Shorewood Blvd.) between 10:00 am and 1:00 pm that Saturday only. The collection point for computers and electronics will be the south end of the parking lot (the trash dumpsters will be towards the north end of the parking lot). Computers and most home electronics can be dropped off for free. Our recycling partner charges a modest fee to recycle old computer monitors, TVs, copier/fax machines and window AC units because of the materials involved. We pass that fee along to you (ranging from \$5-\$60 per item based on size/weight). We can take dehumidifiers, small dorm room style refrigerators, etc. but there may be small pass-through fees for these items as well.

Help keep potentially damaging materials out of our landfills by disposing of your old computer, TVs and other electronics on May 21.

TORNADO AND SEVERE WEATHER AWARENESS WEEK IS APRIL 4-8

Governor Tony Evers has proclaimed April 4-8 as Tornado and Severe Weather Awareness Week in Wisconsin. ReadyWisconsin is encouraging every Wisconsinite to prepare for severe weather and tornadoes that occur during the spring and summer months.

To stay safe from severe weather, follow these tips:

- Create an emergency plan and practice it.
- Know where designated shelters are located at home, work, and school, and be ready to go there when a tornado warning is issued.
- Have multiple ways to receive alerts about approaching severe weather. Outdoor warning sirens, a NOAA Weather Radio, local media, and smart phone apps are all important tools. Don't rely on any single source for important life-saving information.
- If you have a mobile device, make sure it is enabled to receive Wireless Emergency Alerts. On many devices, that option is available in the settings menu.
- Keep up to date on the daily forecast for your area.
- Create an emergency kit for your home. Find tips for building a kit at <https://readywisconsin.wi.gov>

On Thursday, April 7, Wisconsin will conduct its annual statewide tornado drill. At 1:45 pm and 6:45 pm, everyone is encouraged to pause what they are doing and practice going to their designated shelter location. If there is severe weather expected anywhere in the state on April 7, the drill would be postponed to April 8.

During the drill times, the National Weather Service will conduct NOAA Weather Radio tests, which can be heard if actively listening to a weather radio at 1:45 p.m. and 6:45 p.m. Some communities may also choose to test their outdoor warning sirens during the drill times, so don't be alarmed if you hear a siren on April 7!

NIXLE[®] Alerts

The Village sends out notices periodically about events or items of interest to Village residents. We utilize the Nixle[®] Alert System, which is similar to those used on college campuses to notify people of weather or other dangers.

If you haven't already done so, sign up for text alerts by texting VOSH to 888777; or you can register for alerts at the Nixle website (<https://local.nixle.com/register/>); or you can use the Widget on the Village's website (www.shorewood-hills.org/notifications).



Membership Grant Donations Needed

Overview:

The Pool’s membership grant program was developed 14 years ago to provide assistance to members with the payment of annual membership dues. To date, the fund has been able to provide over 100 members with assistance. Most recently, in 2021, the Grant Program helped 17 families with their membership costs. The money used for this purpose comes from voluntary donations and fundraising activities, and does not come from the Pool’s budget or membership income. The following excerpt, from the membership policy document, is the language that guides this venture:

The Shorewood Hills Pool may provide partial grants to a limited number of memberships on an annual basis. Grants will provide reduced rate memberships, up to a 50% reduction.

How to Apply:

Applications for grants will be available through Pool website (under “Forms & Docs” tab), and must be submitted to the Shorewood Hills Pool Committee on or before May 1st. Funding for the grants will be provided for by an access fund maintained by the Shorewood Hills Pool, supported by voluntary contributions and fund raising activities. The Pool Committee will evaluate applications and distribute scholarships by the end of May. The Pool Committee will award available grants with preference for financial need, the expressed value of the Pool to the applicant, and the applicant’s ties to the Shorewood Hills Pool Community. Awards will be limited based on the available dollars and membership availability.

Your help is needed to continue the success of this program. Donations are tax-deductible.

JUNIOR GOLF PROGRAM

Deadline: June 3, 2022

The Blackhawk Junior Golf Program has been one of the best in the state for decades. This year there is going to be a little more structure and blending the history of the Blackhawk Junior Golf Program into a modernized junior golf program.

The **Registration Fee** for Shorewood Hills residents to participate in the program is \$183.75 per participant. Prices include golf instruction, golf, lunch and Blackhawk's famous cookies and lemonade.

Group Lessons will be held on Wednesday mornings in June, July and August:

June 15, 22, 29, July 6, 13, 20, 27, August 3, 10 and the Junior Banquet on Friday, August 12.

Group Lesson Categories and Start Times:

This year will be a little different, so ask questions if you are not sure where your child should go.

Each class will have 45 minutes of instruction and then onto the golf course for 9 holes of golf. Range Rovers will play the 3 holes on the range. Each junior golfer is required to provide his/her own golf clubs, bag, golf balls and tees.

Expectations and event descriptions: All juniors should arrive 15 minutes before their designated class time. Parents are welcome to drop off and pick up juniors when finished.
