





## CANDIDATES' FORUM

### Wednesday, March 23

The Village will host a forum for candidates for Village Trustee and Municipal Judge on Wednesday, March 23 from 6:30 to 8:00 pm. This event will be a virtually Zoom event. Residents will be able to submit questions to the candidates via the Zoom Chat feature or by emailing questions ahead of the forum to [greg.lampe@charter.net](mailto:greg.lampe@charter.net) (**deadline: Noon on March 23**). Questions should be directed to all candidates rather than a specific individual. Everyone is encouraged to participate and get to know the candidates for Trustee and Municipal Judge that will be on the Spring Ballot on April 5.

**In-Person Absentee Voting** is allowed for two weeks before an election (except the Monday before the election). For the Spring Election in-person voting hours are: Tue-Thu, March 22-24 (8:00 am-4:00 pm); Fri, March 25 (8:00 am-12:00 pm); Mon-Fri, March 28-April 1 (8:00 am-4:00 pm); and a special session on Sat, April 2 (9:00 am-12:00 pm). You must be registered to vote. Bring your photo ID.

## VOTER INFORMATION

The Village's goal is for all eligible Shorewood Hills voters to be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted. If residents would like to request an absentee ballot be mailed to them for the Spring Election. The online process is simple, especially if you have a smart phone.

### Absentee Ballot Requests

You must be registered to vote in order to receive a ballot. The easiest way to request an absentee ballot is by going online to [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov). The deadline to request a ballot be mailed to you is Thursday, March 31. You may need to upload a picture of an acceptable proof of identification (Photo ID), which is where the smartphone comes in handy. A ballot must be returned to Village Hall by Election Day. Due to a recent court ruling, you are no longer allowed to have a spouse or other person return your ballot – you may only return YOUR ballot.

### Drop Box

Due to a recent court ruling, “unmanned” drop boxes are no longer allowed to receive absentee ballots. Until the election is over, our drop box outside the Village Hall will be locked. Please mail your completed ballot back ASAP or return your ballot, in person, by 8:00 pm on Election Day (April 5).

### In-Person Absentee Voting

The Village Hall is open for in-person absentee voting. During regular and special office hours (Monday-Thursday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Friday March 25, 8:00 am – 12:00 pm and Friday April 1, 8:00 am – 4:00 pm and Saturday, April 2, 9:00 am – 12:00 pm) you can come to the Village Hall to vote. Absentee voting on the day before an election is prohibited. Before receiving a ballot, you are required to show a photo ID. Only one person can vote at a time, so be prepared to wait (possibly outside) until other voters are done.

### Voter Registration

The easiest way to register is by going online to: [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov). To be eligible to register to vote in Shorewood Hills, you must have resided here for at least 10 consecutive days prior to the next election. If you have moved to a different home in the Village or changed your name, you must re-register. You will need to provide proof of your residency in the Village when registering to vote. [Common proofs of residency](#), among others, include a WI driver's license, a utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government document, or lease. The document must include your name at your Village address. It is possible to register at the polls on Election Day but we encourage everyone to register online.

### Photo Identification

A Photo ID is required to vote. The most common types of acceptable photo ID include: a WI DOT-issued drivers license, a WI DOT-issued identification card, a Military ID card issued by the U.S. Uniformed Services, or a U.S. passport book or card. **The photo ID is only for proof of your identity, it does not require your Village address.** IMPORTANT TO NOTE: An out of state driver's license IS NOT an acceptable ID in Wisconsin; a Wisconsin driver's license or passport may be expired if the expiration date is after November 3, 2020 (the date of the last federal election). There are other forms of acceptable ID for voting purposes (see the [Acceptable forms of Voter ID flyer](#) online). ### Poll Location

Village Hall ([810 Shorewood Blvd](#)) in the basement. Polls open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm.

### Signing the Poll Book

All voters must sign the poll book in order to obtain a ballot on Election Day. The Village now utilizes an electronic poll book called the Badger Book that has speed up the check-in process. Voters sign a computer screen similar to those used at grocery/department stores. You will still be required to state your name and address, show an appropriate photo ID and sign the electronic poll book. Voters unable to sign the poll book because of a disability are exempt from this requirement. If this applies to you, simply tell the Election Officials that you are unable to sign because of a disability. You do not need to disclose the nature of your disability to the Election Officials or to any observers. Election Officials will record "exempt by order of inspectors" in the poll book.

### FELICE BORISY-RUDIN

I am honored to have served as your municipal judge the last 4 years and previously as a Trustee for 11 years. I first moved to Shorewood Hills 50 years ago and consider this Village my home. After two decades absence, I returned in 2001 with my husband and kids. I am an attorney and a member of the Wisconsin State Bar. After graduating law school in 2012, I spent 9 years practicing civil law, including 5 years as a municipal prosecutor. In my day job, I am the Policy Analyst for the Wisconsin Alcohol Policy Project at the Medical College of Wisconsin.



During the COVID-19 pandemic, I adapted and kept our municipal court functioning, by first moving the municipal court virtual, and then eventually bringing the municipal court back to in-person (but masked) hearings, with a continued option to anyone to request an appearance by telephone or Zoom. I also created new written forms so that anyone could make a written plea or request for a delay, and submit it by email, mail, fax, or the Village drop-box.

Some of the cases I've heard as municipal judge include parking tickets, traffic violations (including first offense OWI), theft, underage drinking, trespass, and possession of marijuana or drug paraphernalia. My court is a place where each person is seen, heard, and treated with respect. At initial appearances, I explain the nature of each person's citations, the possible penalties, and the choices available for making a plea. I answer questions. I encourage anyone who wants to contest their citation to plead not guilty and attend a pre-trial conference with the municipal prosecutor. Anyone who doesn't reach a pre-trial agreement is given a trial date. At trial, I listen to the evidence and arguments and then issue a verdict. I won't find someone guilty unless the evidence is clear, satisfactory, and convincing. I also give people a chance to request a payment plan or a reduced or deferred payment if they can't afford to pay.

I hope that you will vote for me on April 5, 2022. Thank you for your support.

## **SHOREWOOD HILLS YOUTH BASKETBALL PROGRAM - SPRING 2022**

The Shorewood Hills Youth Basketball Program is adding a spring session in 2022! The program is open to Shorewood Hills Elementary School students and Village residents in grade levels 1 through 6. The program will teach the fundamental rules and skills of basketball in a safe, fun, encouraging, and inclusive learning environment. ### FOUR CORNERS CAMP 2022

Four Corners Camp is an eight-week outdoor recreation program held at Four Corners Park from 9:30 am to 12:25 pm\*, Monday through Friday for Village children ages 4 to 6 years and who have not yet entered first grade. Camp activities include outdoor play, arts and crafts, music, games, field trips, and a one-night campout for six-year-olds at the end of the program.

*\*On days when there are no swim lessons, pick-up is at 12:00 noon at Four Corners Park.*

Swimming lessons at Shorewood Hills Pool are provided in conjunction with the Pool's morning swim lesson program; on swim days, campers walk with the staff to the Pool from Four Corners Park. During inclement weather, camp is held in the Community Center.

### NIXLE<sup>®</sup> Alerts

It is similar to systems used on college campuses to notify people of weather or other dangers. We no longer send out notices from Staff's regular email accounts.

Nixle<sup>®</sup> Alerts is a self subscribed system. If you haven't already done so, you can sign up for text alerts by simply texting VOSH to 888777; or you can register for alerts at the Nixle website (<https://local.nixle.com/register/>); or you can use the Widget on the Village's website ([www.shorewood-hills.org/notifications](http://www.shorewood-hills.org/notifications)) to sign up.
