

## **BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE DAMAGE DONE AT SHOREWOOD HILLS POOL**

### **Items to be repaired/replaced**

Basement/Mechanicals (most expensive repairs/replacements):

- Boilers – single biggest expense
- Building electrical
- Water heaters
- Pool pumps - main pool, wading pool, and wading pool feature (mushroom/fountains)
- Water softeners

Building (Non/basement)

- Wooden built in storage shelf (backhall near basement)
- Wall partitioning off manager office (opened up bottom 2 ft. of wall to dry/treat for mold)
- Checker desk

Pool Furniture – Most of the deck furniture fared okay and has been cleaned/sanitized. Not sure if lounges/benches were damaged.

- Mats – All (161) mats discarded (most from deck, and a few spares from basement)
- Guard umbrellas (a few were damaged by getting tossed around in the flood water)

Pool Equipment – Lost a fair amount of miscellaneous pool equipment. Nothing overly expensive on their own, but certainly things that add up when put together. Some had physical damage, most was just water logged with flood water that could not be cleaned. Below are a few examples (the entire stock of some of these items were stored low enough that all were under water or just touching the flood water).

- Kick boards/pull buoys
- Water Aerobics dumbbells
- Lifejackets
- Misc. pool toys (used for lessons, baby pool, etc.)
- Pool Noodles
- Guard tubes
- Exercise Mats

Misc. – Obviously, there is a long list of "miscellaneous items" that will have to be replaced:

- Computers (2) – Used for check-in at main entrance
- Printers (2) – In managers' office
- Pressure Washers (2)
- Water cooler (rented from Capital Coffee) – may or may not be broken
- Rental Towels (rented from BayTowel) – had to toss a few that we un-cleanable
- 1st Aid supplies (stored on bottom shelf that was ripped out)
- A few book cases/cabinets from manager office

A detailed log of anything thrown away is being kept for insurance purposes. Most items have not been replaced yet, but the process to replace larger items (electrical, boilers, pumps, etc.) will have to start soon.

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
