Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District's West Intercepting System is a complex network of sewers that provides service to the near west side of Madison, Middleton, Shorewood Hills and Westport. The original West Interceptor was built in 1916, and there have been several extensions, reliefs and replacements added to the system over the years. This project will replace the existing interceptor to increase capacity, which ensures the safe and reliable conveyance of wastewater while protecting public health and the environment.

The District plans to construct Phase 1 of the West Interceptor Shorewood Relief pipe next spring. Phase 1 will start in Indian Hills Park and drain to the east. From Indian Hills Park, it will run on the north side of the railroad tracks to Shorewood Boulevard. The new pipe will be installed in the same location as the existing pipe.
